The board wants everyone to be safe so we can all get together as soon as possible. Please make sure you stay safe distances from others, keep your hands away from your face. Wash your hands frequently and use your hand sanitizer. Even if you wash your hands with hand sanitizer because you are not near a sink, wash them with soap and water again as soon as you can. Soap breaks down the fatty barrier that viruses use for protection.

Bleach, hydrogen peroxide can be used. Both can be used on hard surfaces but have a bleaching action of cloth and clothing. Bleach should always be mixed with water before using it . Hydrogen peroxide of at least 3% can be used as is. Leave these solutions on the surface you are cleaning for at least a minute if not more. Isopropyl alcohol can be used if it is above 60 percent alcohol. It won't bleach cloth.
